

Ship Your Wild Game with Confidence

Lynden Air Cargo provides scheduled air service from hubs in Western Alaska, helping hunters and guides move their harvest safely and efficiently from the field to final destination, including chilled or frozen game meat, seafood, and items such as antlers, capes, and taxidermy materials.

SHIPPING REQUIREMENTS—QUICK REFERENCE

Packaging

- Shipper provides secure, leak proof packaging
- Containers must maintain temperature up to 8 hours
- Cargo may be exposed to outdoor temps during handling
- No leaks permitted

Recommended containers:

Rigid totes, fish boxes, coolers, bins, lined boxes

Important: game bags on pallets must be fully tarped

Labeling

- Shipper name and phone number on all containers, and pieces being shipped
- Clearly mark “CHILL” or “FREEZE” – Unlabeled meat defaults to frozen storage
- Label each package and the air waybill

Important: chill storage in Anchorage is **not available during September peak season**

Air Waybill Basics

- Declaration form required for all game meat, fish, antlers, and capes
- One hunter per air waybill
- Meat, antlers, and gear must ship separately
- One set of antlers per air waybill

Backhaul Shipments to Anchorage

- Pickup required within 24 hours of notification
- Storage after 24 hours: \$150 per pallet per day
- Shipment must be paid in full before release

Game Meat Backhaul Pricing

- Recommended packaging: \$0.65/lb.
- Tarped: \$1.30/lb.

Using an Expeditor for Pick Up:

- Clearly list the expediting company on your Air Waybill and declaration
- Pickup must occur within 24 hours of notification; storage fees apply thereafter
- The shipment must be paid in full before it will be released to the expeditor

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Storage space is limited during peak season
- Freeze/chill storage, if available, is first-come, first-served
- Flights and return timing may change
- Some gear may be hazardous materials
- Game meat and seafood ship at shipper's risk
- No claims may be filed
