



Specialized Overland Transportation

From the Trans-Alaska Pipeline construction in the 1970s to today's global oilfield operations, Lynden has a long history of supporting the oil and gas industry in Prudhoe Bay. Dependable and efficient transportation and logistics are critical to the growing exploration, development and production on the North Slope.

Lynden Oilfield Services provides support for oilfield exploration and production, and transportation and logistics solutions to the companies working to develop Alaska's oil and gas resources. Working in the challenging Arctic environment – and sensitive tundra – requires specialized equipment designed for minimal impact on delicate Arctic oil fields.

PistenBully Fleet

Our fleet of PB600 heavy haul PistenBullys are low-ground-pressure vehicles that operate across frozen tundra, ice, and flowing water. They can deliver a variety of freight to oil field customers in Arctic villages and other locations without road access. Custom-built sleighs allow the vehicles to pull oversized freight, vehicles and anything else needed to support exploration, development and oil and gas operations in the Arctic. The fleet has been customized to serve as 'polar all-rounders,' adding trail grooming, recovery and search and rescue to the service options.

Special Features

- Extended range capability reduces the environmental impact of refueling in the field and expands remote delivery options.
- 15-kilowatt hydraulic generators power equipment during transport and can be used as a power source in emergency situations.
- Built-in hydraulic transfer pump can transfer liquid products onsite without the need for infrastructure.
- Vehicles can establish and maintain trails into remote locations with trail path markers, and assess ice thickness for frozen water crossings.

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Towing & Trailing

- Freight sleighs are available in 132" x 30" width with adjustable lengths to accommodate a variety of equipment sizes and a 70,000-pound payload.
- Containerized freight or other cargo may be loaded into and onto any intermodal container, including a barge platform, ISO tank or freight container, and transported to Deadhorse via truck for attachment to a sleigh for final delivery. No transloading required.
- Sleighs with skis can carry 80,000 pounds, including ISO tank fluids of up to 6,200 gallons.

Permitted Areas of Operation

We deliver to remote locations across the North Slope where low-ground-pressure equipment is required, including:

- North Slope Borough and villages
- Alaska Department of Natural Resources
- Alaska Department of Fish and Game
- Bureau of Land Management
- U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service

Working safe in sensitive terrain

Lynden employees are trained in environmental, social, traditional, and cultural awareness. We also educate our teams about native wildlife, waste management, emergency response and winter survival, first aid/CPR and the North Slope Training Cooperative (NSTC). Our North Slope equipment is maintained by qualified mechanics at our Deadhorse facility, and we work under an operating plan with procedures for emergencies and spill prevention that has been shared with local, state and federal partners. Safety is our No. 1 priority.
